# Principal's Message

# **Professional Learning**

On Tuesday afternoon our staff participated in a three hour School Development Day session. The afternoon commenced with an information session outlining the requirements and timeline for teaching staff to obtain a Working With Children Check.

We then participated in an information session outlining the role and history of the Anti-Racism Contact Officer. Principals are required to nominate a member of the teaching staff to be the school's Anti-Racism Contact Officer (ARCO). The ARCO, Mrs Baldwinson, is the contact between students, staff, parents and community members who wish to make a complaint regarding racism and the appropriate procedure that will be used to resolve the complaint, including the person who will have responsibility for dealing with the complaint - the delegate.

Our afternoon ended with a *Positive Behaviour for Learning* activity which involved identifying form and function of behaviour. In very basic terms, form is the identification of the behaviour and function is the identification of why it has occurred.
