Principal's Message

Professional Learning

Next year Mrs Adam will be undergoing training to implement the Targeted Early Numeracy (TEN) intervention program. This program provides support for students in learning numeracy and problem solving strategies in the early years. TEN complements the regular numeracy programs in the classroom. One Stage Teaching occurs within a normal daily lesson block, without withdrawal or an additional specialist teacher.

A Reminder to Parents to Notify the School About Your Child's Health

We welcome information from parents about your child's health, even if you are not requesting specific support from our school. Our school asks for medical information when you enrol your child. It is also important that you let us know if your child's health care needs change or if a new health condition develops.

Individual health care plans should be developed for:

- severe asthma, type 1 diabetes, epilepsy and anaphylaxis
- any student who is diagnosed as being at risk of an emergency
- any student who requires the administration of specific health care procedures

Information from your child's medical practitioner, provided by parents, will inform the planning process. The plan will describe the student's needs and how the school plans to meet these needs during the school day, on excursions and in other variations in school routine, such as sport. The plan must also detail procedures to be followed if an emergency

arises. Plans should be reviewed annually or when the parent notifies the school that the student's health needs have changed.

2017 Western Band Camp

The Western Band Camp is on again! The 2017 Camp will be held at Lake Burrendong Sport and Recreation Centre from Sunday 19 February – Friday 24 February 2017. The camp is open to all public school students from years 5-12 and caters for musicians of all levels from beginner to advanced. During the week students will participate in a range of programs including concert band, advanced band and instrumental group tutorials.

The camp aims to give students a valuable educational and musical experience. It will give students the opportunity to enhance their skills by working with professional musicians, tutors and conductors, while exposing them to a variety of music and styles. Students who attend camp will be eligible for selection for 2017 State Wind Band who performs at the Sydney Opera House and Beyond the Divide band tours.

Bass guitarists are welcome to attend, however, there are no positions available for vocalists, electric, acoustic guitarists or violinists. Separate camps are available for these students. Piano students are welcome to attend, with the understanding that they will be placed with the percussion section and will be expected to rotate turns with the others. A single drum kit is provided for drummers and they will be expected to rotate turns on the equipment with percussion instruments.

It is expected that all students who apply will be accepted. Please contact Mrs Baldwinson or the office for an application package. Cost of the camp is \$400 and needs to be paid in full before Friday, 10th February.

FIGHT THE BITE!

Mosquito borne infections

Information for people who live in or are travelling to flood affected areas in south west and western NSW



Mosquitoes can transmit infections, including Ross River and Barmah Forest virus.

Stagnant water left behind by the recent floods and heavy rain in NSW provides ideal breeding conditions for mosquitoes.

Take simple measures to prevent being bitten by mosquitoes and reduce your risk of infection.

Summary

- In the last few months, inland NSW has experienced heavy rains and significant flooding, resulting in water lying around. This water provides ideal conditions for mosquito breeding.
- NSW Health has received reports of a large number of mosquitoes in south western and western NSW; mosquitoes in these areas have been detected carrying the Ross River or Barmah Forest virus.
- With the increased mosquito numbers, there is an increased risk for people to be infected with mosquito borne diseases, including Ross River and Barmah Forest virus. More rarely mosquitoes may carry Murray Valley encephalitis virus and Kunjin virus.

Signs you may have a mosquito related disease

Many people will have no symptoms if infected. However a few days after being bitten some will feel generally unwell, and may have sore joints, muscle aches, rash, fever and tiredness.

Protecting yourself from a mosquito disease

Simple steps to avoid mosquito bites include:

- Checking fly screens on all windows and doors are in place and do not have any rips or holes.
- When outside cover up as much as possible with light-coloured, loose-fitting clothing and covered footwear, especially in the early morning and evening.

- Apply mosquito repellent regularly to exposed areas (as directed on the container). Repellents containing Diethyl Toluamide (DEET) or Picaridin are best. Repellents containing oil of lemon eucalyptus or p-Menthane-3.8-diol (PMD) also provide adequate protection.
- Devices that use light to attract and electrocute insects are NOT effective.
- When mosquitoes are present inside the room use over the counter insecticide sprays, especially behind furniture and in dark places.
- When camping, make sure your tent is well protected with flyscreens, or sleep under mosquito nets.
