Principal's message

NAIDOC

Well done to everyone for a fantastic NAIDOC yesterday. We were very fortunate to have some knowledgeable guests to deliver Aboriginal cultural knowledge to our students. Thank you to Cecil, Yvonne, Allan and Alan who presented workshops on net making, storytelling, weapons, tools, art and traditional indigenous games.

National School Chaplaincy Program

Our school recently applied to participate in the National School Chaplaincy Program (NSCP) for 2020-2022, and we have been approved. We will be funded under the program for a minimum of 400 hours per year for each year commencing in 2020.

NSW public schools are required to engage a chaplaincy provider from a prequalified list of chaplaincy providers. We will commence this process next month when the list is updated.

The NSCP is an initiative funded by the Commonwealth Government to provide chaplaincy services to schools throughout Australia. The NSW Government has been administering the NSCP on behalf of the Commonwealth Government since 2015.

The purpose of the NSCP is to support the wellbeing of school students through the provision of pastoral care services and strategies to support the wellbeing of the broader school community. These may include volunteering activities, excursions, lunchtime activities and parent/carer workshops. Participation in the NSCP is voluntary for schools and students.

Cooler Classrooms Program

We have progressed to the next stage of the Cooler Classrooms program, with tenders soon to open. I have a pre-tender meeting on Monday, so will know more after that!

LED Lighting

We have commenced our gradual upgrade to LED lighting in classrooms. This week the library and the 2/3/4 and 4/5/6 classrooms have been completed. This will, over time, reduce the cost of maintenance. The lighting is also a better quality and we won't have flickers etc.

Driver Training Simulator

Last Friday, we had a driver simulator here at school. Our students used the simulator to drive in normal conditions, with animals crossing the road and whilst texting and under the influence of alcohol. Students were measured in terms of "near misses", collisions and times crossing the centre line. As an example, I increased my speed by an average of 9km per hour, swayed 0.5m more and crossed the centre line 22% more whilst texting.

Creative Community Concepts Drought Tour

We will be hosting a Fast 4 Sports Games Day on December 12 from 3:30pm at the Tottenham Sportsground. Activities will include Laser Tag, League Tag and Footy 4 Fun (0-5 years). All participants will receive a free BBQ

In conjunction, a Mental Fitness presentation will be delivered for our year 7 and 8 students. It focuses on practising gratitude, mindfulness and having a sense of purpose.

Timely reminders

Students are not to arrive at school before 8.35am as there is no supervision before this time.

If children are being dropped off or picked up from school, we ask that you do so at the Meryula Street entrance (near library) to avoid the bus zone at the front of school. We also ask that you remain at the seating in front of the library until children are dismissed.
