As our excursion is early next term, we require all payments to be finalised by Wednesday 16 October.



Science update

In science we have been focusing on our assessments in Stage 4 and 5, and studying the universe in Stage 5. Both groups of students have been working hard on their practical investigations. They have covered a range of topics, with some interesting results on the topics of slime, sparklers, golf ball flight, human reaction times, and the distance of different catapult designs. The focus of the assessment has been on structuring scientific reports, and the students have shown some exceptional investigative skills.

Year 11 Biology have been studying and revising ecosystems, including completing an in depth study of the ecosystem at Wambangalang with their WAP class. Kayla and Michelle had to count and measure trees, hollows, collect insects and view a carpet python up close!

Year 11 have been finishing their courses, looking at farm case studies and revision in Agriculture, while Year 12 have been focussing on the use and development of technology in Investigating Science. Joel has been preparing for the trial and final HSC examinations, while Kayla and Michelle have been preparing for their final examinations, for this week and next.
