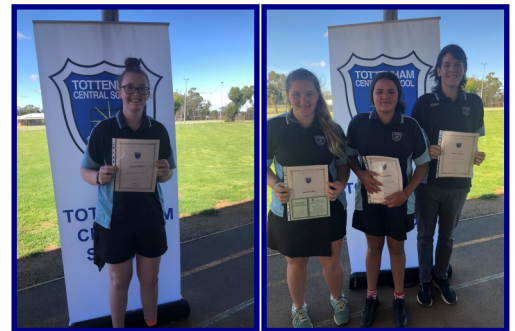

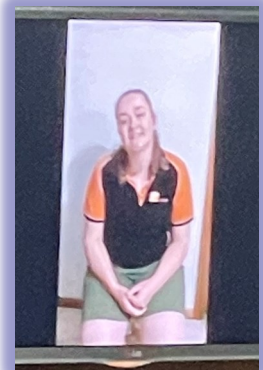
# Graduation Dinner 2021

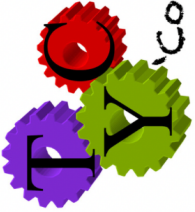
