NAPLAN

Last week, our 2021 NAPLAN results were released. Our results were very pleasing and continue to show outstanding improvement.

- 40% of our students achieved results in the top two bands for reading. This is a significant improvement from 14% in 2019.
- 28% of our students achieved results in the top two bands for numeracy. This is an improvement from 17% in 2019.
- Every student in our school achieved at or above the national minimum standard in reading, writing, grammar and punctuation, spelling and numeracy.

HSC

Congratulations to Lachlan Makim! You have nearly made it to the end of a unique and very tough year.

The official last day for Year 12 is this Friday, September 17 2021, however, students will be supported up until their exams. From the beginning of Term 4, Year 12/HSC students can continue to attend school for revision, learning, wellbeing support and to have access to their teachers.

A reminder for all students to return their portfolios to school as soon as possible. Thank you.


Calendar Artwork Update


