Principal's message

Welcome to Term 3 and hopefully the start of some warmer weather. I hope our families had a restful and enjoyable holiday and managed to stay sickness free. Following is a brief overview of how we are continuing to ensure our school remains COVID-safe throughout the term.

As we continue to prioritise student and staff learning and wellbeing while at school, our layered COVID-smart measures will remain for Term 3. These 'baseline measures' are aligned to the NSW Government's general community settings and include:

- \Rightarrow Testing if unwell RATs are available for all families
- \Rightarrow Encouragement of mask wearing
- \Rightarrow Encouragement of vaccinations and boosters
- \Rightarrow Requirements for close contacts to test and wear masks each day
- ⇒ Boosted cleaning and hygiene practices


The department has updated its policy regarding COVID-19 vaccination for employees following an independent risk assessment of school settings and consultation with unions and relevant stakeholders. While vaccination will no longer be a requirement for our staff from 1 August 2022, it is pleasing to see that a recent survey highlighted that more than 99% of the department's active school-based workforce have had at least two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine. The department will continue to strongly encourage all our staff to keep up to date with their COVID-19 vaccinations as a way of protecting themselves, students, and our school community.

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. Tottenham Central School wishes to work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier, and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or are registered with the NSW Education and Standards Authority for home schooling. Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.



For Semester 1, Tottenham Central School's attendance rate was **83.6%** below the state average of **85.2%.** Working together, I strongly believe we can significantly lift this figure. The following graph shows the attendance percentage bands of students at TCS for Semester 1. Our aim is to boost the amount of students in the green. All research shows those students not in the green – 90% or above - are educationally at risk.



We totally understand that children become sick, there are unavoidable appointments, travel that needs to occur, and misadventures that pop up. In these circumstances, we ask that you justify your child's absence by responding to the SMS sent each day, or contact the school via phone, email or with a note.

We look forward to working in partnership with you to support your child to fulfil their life opportunities.

There are many exciting cultural, social, sporting and learning opportunities ahead this term for Tottenham Central School and we look forward to a plentiful and productive term.

Good luck to Bailey Lloyd-Small who is participating in the PSSA State Cross Country trials tomorrow at Eastern Creek.


Book Fair



Stage 4 History

Whilst continuing the study of the ancient past, Stage 4 will remain looking at the fascinating Ancient Egyptians. Their mummified hot dogs, King Tutankhamen and Cleopatra, were exhumed at the end of last term. They were remeasured and although they had shrunk slightly, they still looked similar, had little odour and were quite pliable and well preserved. We will spend a few more weeks looking at conflict, trade and the legacy left by Ancient Egypt before delving into Ancient China mid-term.



Stage 4 Science

After studying forces at the end of last term, Stage 4 are starting to look at mixtures and will be learning about solvents, filtering, evaporation, and distillation.











Stage 4 Visual Arts

This term, Stage 4 are focusing on Urban Art which will see students examining artists like Keith Haring and Banksy. They will experiment with screen printing, graffiti and digital logos.

At the end of last term, they completed fantastic paintings of a dragon's eye, which will be displayed during book week for all to admire.







Geography

Stage 5 will begin to investigate the topic of 'Environmental Change and Management', which looks at the broad topics of forests, inland water, and environments. Throughout the semester local, national and international environmental change will be examined.

Stage 5 Science

After studying 'Energy and Matter' in ecosystems, Stage 5 are enjoying the new topic of Body Systems. They will learn about the incredible intricate body systems that coordinate to sustain life. Among other examinations, the students will examine the structure of a sheep's brain as an example of a mammalian brain.

5 ways to love your teeth!

This year for Dental Health Week (1-7 August), the Australian Dental Association is asking Aussies to love their teeth! Here are five ways you can do this.

1) Take your teeth on a date to the dentist

You may not have been for a little while or it may be time for your regular check-up, take this as your reminder to take your teeth on a date and see your dentist! Your teeth will thank you.

2) Care for your teeth by brushing every day

Show your teeth you care by brushing two times every day. Brush once in the morning and once at night. At night, brushing is best done last thing before bed and no food or drinks to be had after.

3) Spoil your teeth by cleaning between them every day

Cleaning between your teeth helps to remove bacteria and food that build up during the day. Not cleaning these spaces can cause gums to become inflamed and sometimes tooth decay can develop.

4) Treat your teeth to healthy foods and drinks

The World Health Organization recommends adults have 6 or less teaspoons (24 grams) of sugar each day. Sticking to this recommendation can decrease the risk of tooth decay developing. Choose to drink water during the day and if having a sweet treat, do so together with a main meal instead of snacking on the treat between meals.

5) Show your teeth love by using them for their intended purpose

Teeth are made to chew and smile. They are not made for opening bottles, or packets. These habits can increase the risk of breaking or cracking teeth. Love your teeth by only using them for their intended purpose.
