

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


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Book Fair Update

PSSA State Cross Country



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Primary news—Term 2 with Years 5/6

Rite of Passage

During Term 2, Years 5/6 and Stage 4 had the opportunity to undertake a free 8 week program from the 'Centre for Hope Organisation' in Newcastle, NSW. The program focused on the development of strengths to support students as they navigate a complex time of life. With a focus on Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander backgrounds, this program draws cultural rites of from passage throughout history, encompassing spirituality and Country, ancestral connections and family, culture and



community to assist all students with cultural identity, managing risks and improving mental health and wellbeing. Over the weeks, students completed activities which included participating in games, drawing pictures and gardening. At the end of the program, all students received their own water bottle.

History – Australian Colonies

Last term, Years 5/6 students completed their History Unit 'Australian Colonies' with researching an event or development that impacted on Australia's early colonies. These colonial events include the Gold Rush, Burke and Wills, Battle of Pinjarra and Eureka Stockade.




