

MS Readathon Kicks Off!







On Monday, 1 August, primary and secondary students had the privilege of hearing from two former Tottenham Central School students who suffer from Multiple Sclerosis (MS) - a disabling disease of the brain and spinal cord. Kristen Jarvis and Ronnie Bowen spoke to our students about what it is, how the disease effects the body, how it affects them personally, the types of medication they require, and how funds raised assist in their lives.





Their stories, while incredibly sad, have encouraged our students to understand a little more about the hardships faced by those suffering with MS and why it is so important to participate in this valuable fundraising cause. Participating in the MS Readathon not only assists our students in their reading journey and encourages them to develop life-long reading habits, it also raises awareness of this debilitating disease and raises much needed money for research into a cure and developing and providing medications. All money raised will help





support the thousands of families living with MS in Australia.

Stage 4 Maths

In Maths, Stage 4 have been learning about Graphs. Within this unit they created a divided bar graph of the different coloured M&Ms in a large packet. This required them to count, collate, total, turn the total into a percentage, and find the percentage of their 20cm bar graph.



Stage 5 Maths
