The pressure builds and builds, however at some point the lid comes off the bottle. All the shaking results in a lot of mess and try as you might, once the fizzing starts, the lid is next to impossible to get back on. This is often the case when children get home in their safe environments with safe people, their lids explode as they have been holding in their stress levels all day. This is the case for adults too. It always helps to understand why children are behaving the way they are, to help them regulate. It can't hurt for us adults too.



Update from Mrs Radford

In Science, Stage 4 has been learning about 'mixtures and separations' and have recently decantated and filtered muddy water. They have also had the opportunity to investigate the difference between suspensions, solutions and colloids.











In Visual Arts, Stage 4 has begun the subjective exploration of the techniques and conventions of graffiti and 'urban art'. So far, students have created a personal graffiti tag and some Keith Banksy inspired artwork. Keith Banksy is the iconic designer of much of the Mambo clothing artwork.













Stage 5 has whole heartedly enjoyed investigating 'body systems' this term with some sheep brain and heart dissections throughout the unit. They have started their new topic on 'motion' and will move on to learn about the transferring of energy towards the end of the term.

During National Science week, Stage 5 had the chance to simulate the making of glass optical fibres using hot glue. Glass fibre optics are used extensively in our modern society, in telecommunications infrastructure and medical equipment in particular.




