Literacy and Numeracy Week

This week is Literacy and Numeracy Week, which provides a unique opportunity for schools to recognise and celebrate the achievements of students and the work of teachers, parents and members of the community who support young people to develop stronger literacy and numeracy skills. Mrs Attenborough has been sharing numeracy skills across the school and the primary school participated in a cooking lesson organised by Mrs Horsburgh, utilising their literacy and numeracy skills in everyday tasks. NAPLAN results also went home to parents and provide us with an opportunity to understand the skills our students possess that are essential to progress through school life and beyond and areas we need to support our students further in literacy and numeracy development.

Kindergarten Transition

We are excited to announce a new transition program for kindergarten students in 2023. We will be holding a parent information session this term to outline the details further. Our new Kindergarten students will be joining us from Week 3 next term to transition to big school. We are extremely excited to welcome our new students and parents. Starting school is a big milestone for children and their families. Their transition between learning environments can be both challenging and exciting. The importance of a positive transition to school experience has been constantly emphasised in research around the world. Visitors will have the option of utilising the current QR code check in or the iPad. School Visitor Check-in keeps visitor records secure and under a restricted access environment. SRC PJ Day - Friday, 9 September


The SRC are fundraising for 'The School of St Judes'. Our first event will be a Pyjama Day.



National Literacy and Numeracy Week

This week is National Literacy and Numeracy Week. As part of this, K/l came to visit Mrs Attenborough's room to practise some sharing (dividing). They listened to the story 'The Doorbell Rang' and then practised sharing teddies in equal groups. Mrs Attenborough showed the students a magic number that she could get from any 3-digit number by using a simple subtraction and addition strategy. Years 2/3/4 and 5/6 will be participating in lessons later this week and next week.

Ways in which parents can also help students as part of National Literacy and Numeracy Week:

Read to your kids

This week mostly encourages the participation of children as they are still in their formative years. Use this week to spend quality reading time with your children or children around you. Don't just limit yourself to bedtime stories, dust off some of your favourite childhood books, and gather the kids around for story time.

Encourage writing

All through Literacy & Numeracy Week do your best to encourage the children around you to write at any given opportunity. Some ways you can go about that is having them practise their handwriting, write out the grocery list for shopping, or even write our measurements and ingredients for cooking. Whatever opportunity you get to write, make sure you involve your kids in it this week.

Play board games

Games can be a fun way to educate children, especially as they have relatively short attention spans. This week indulge kids in some fun spelling games like Pictionary, Boggle, or Scrabble. Make sure you don't leave out the numeracy aspect, get them involved in games like Monopoly to cater to that.

Wether Challenge

This year we were involved in the School Merino Wether Challenge. We received our six Merino wethers in March and the students worked with them for six months, gaining practical hands on sheep management in the lead up to two days of judging at Dubbo last week.

This year's School Merino Wether Challenge in NSW was the biggest one yet, of this annual competition organised by the NSW Stud Merino Breeders' Association, with support from AWI. The initiative aims to educate and engage students on the commercial production of Merino sheep by giving them a memorable 'hands on' experience covering a broad range of sheep and wool production skills.

Last Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, Shauna, Hayley, Maddi, Isaac and Dominic attended the Rabobank National Merino Sheep Show and Ram Sale. The students participated in a variety of workshops looking at sheep management. They also prepared and presented the wethers for judging according to the meat and wool quality of the sheep.

As mentioned on Facebook, it really was wonderful to watch our students work with and help students from other schools with their sheep. Although we didn't win any prizes, we all had a valuable learning experience that we can apply to the program next year













Year 11 Sport, Lifestyle and Recreation


