Principal's message

We are nearing the end of the term but it's still all systems go at Tottenham Central School. We have lots to get done including our whole school performance in Week 10 and farewelling our Year 12 students at their graduation in Dubbo next week.

Prior to the end of term, 2023 kindergarten students will receive a transition package. This information pack will include school information, details about our Term 4 transition program and enrolment forms. We will hold an information session early in Term 4 to answer any questions, provide a tour of the kindergarten classroom and school and an overview of the school procedures and expectations. If you have questions in the meantime, please do not hesitate to contact myself or Miss Moore.

We are launching our parent app at the end of this term. Our Sentral parent app will make communication quicker and easier. In Week 10, families will receive their portal key. You will simply need to download the app on your phone and enter your key. Once you login, you will see your child's attendance heat map, be able to respond to student absences, access your child's reports, view the school newsletter and calendar and teachers can communicate through a newsfeed. Later in the year we will be rolling out excursion permission notes and payments which will be done through the app. Early in Term 4 we will hold a parent information session to support parents using the app. We look forward to seeing many parents there and making communication more streamlined. Of course, for those families who still need it, paper copies will still be available, and you can always contact the school via phone should you need anything.

Next week we have two important and exciting events. On Tuesday, the Department of Education has chosen Tottenham Central School as one of the schools to feature in their promotion of excellence in public education, particularly rural and remote areas. We are excited to host a film and photography crew in the school for the day to showcase our best. On Wednesday we will be visited by the Director of Educational Leadership, Charles Dwyer and the Executive Director School Performance Rural South and West to showcase our wonderful school and share the great things we are doing. It is important that we put our best foot forward as we do each day and wear our school uniform with pride, showcasing respect, excellence and responsibility at all times. I am excited to show what our school is achieving.

Our Wiradjuri language class have been lucky enough to have some sessions with Belinda Lindsay, Wiradjuri Language teacher. Our students are learning the Acknowledgment of Country and greetings in language. I am extremely proud of their effort and dedication and the pride in which they are rekindling the local traditional language.

Check-in assessment for Years 3, 4, 5 & 6

The Check-in assessment is a NSW Department of Education online literacy and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning.

The assessment can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs. Students with a disability may receive the same level of support during the assessment they would normally receive in the classroom.

- The assessment will be scheduled for our Year 6 students during Term 3, Weeks 8 - 10
- The assessment will be scheduled for our Year 3, 4 & 5 students during Term 4, Weeks 1 - 4
- All students complete a reading assessment and a numeracy assessment. Year 6 students will also complete a writing task.

School hats!

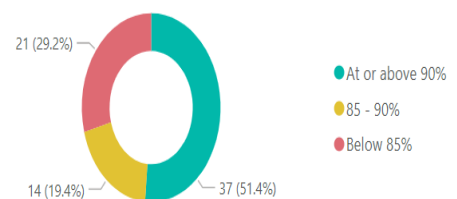
Please ensure your child comes to school each and every day with a school hat in their bag. At the end of last term, each student was gifted a new school hat with their name on it.

School Attendance Level

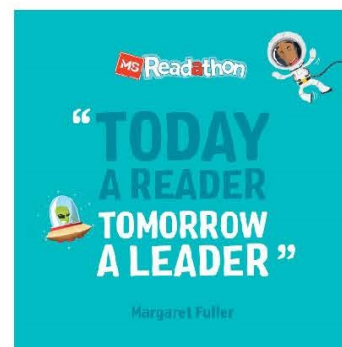

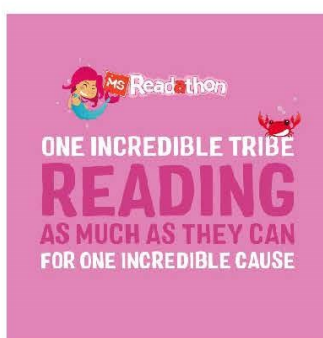

In Science, Year 5/6 have been studying light. The students investigated shadows and the idea that materials can be transparent, translucent, or opaque. Another group of students had the challenge to make catapults to see who could get their catapult to throw a small object the greatest distance. Years 2/3/4 have been studying the conduction of heat and completed an experiment to investigate which material was the best conductor of heat out of metal, plastic and wood. In Geography, K/1 have been investigating maps and the idea of a bird's eye view. They made a map of the classroom using concrete material.

All of the primary students have been discussing the idea of being grateful for the good things in their lives. They all helped to create the above display.

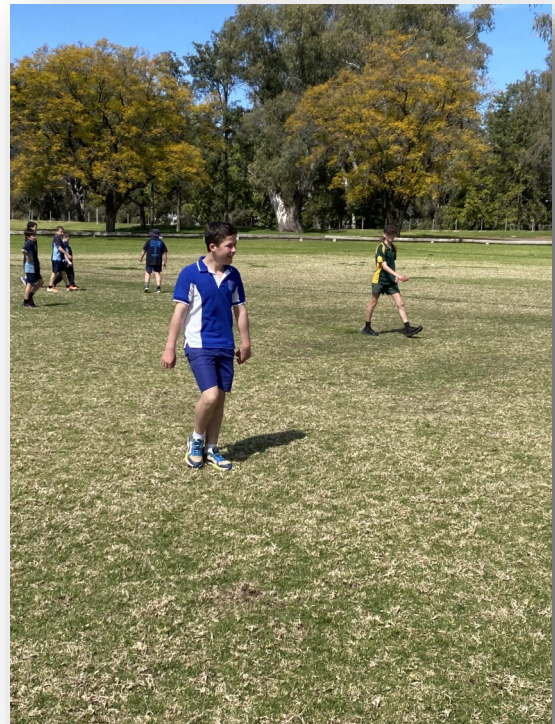

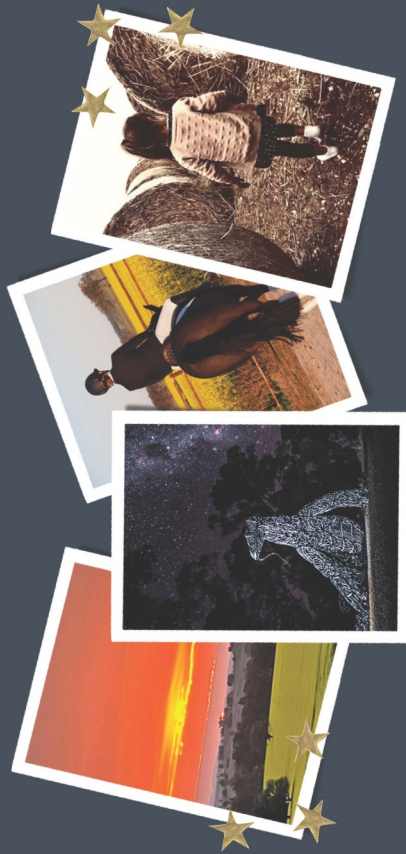
