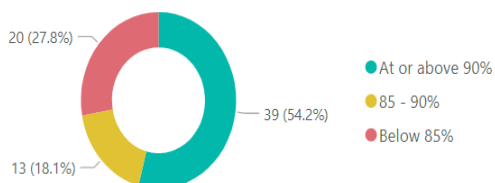
Thank you to everyone who dressed up in their pyjamas last week. The SRC has raised \$106 for 'The School of St Jude' in Tanzania.


