### Principal's message



At your school, there might be students who have a disability, or who are new to speaking the local language. Form the habit of being positive towards these students and giving them a few moments of your time to assist whenever you can.


### \* Have a screen-time limit


Your distraction could be videos, games, or connecting with friends. Form the habit of limiting your screen time so that you can balance your life with other things away from the screen.
